ACCEPTABLE MARKING METHODS

Since the most effective method of straightening a wheel is to first remove the tire, it stands to reason that the best method of marking a repaired wheel is to attach a label to the tire before reinstalling the tire.

Specific information about this repair has been recorded on a technical record, which is filed with the repair invoice. For details, contact above named business and provide them with the Date and Invoice Number recorded on this label.	

A stick-on label can be attached to the wheel under the tire. An acceptable label must be permanent and need only contain information which is unique to the repair facility.

The example shown, displays data that can be traced back to the actual repair report, which should also identify the repair technician.

The label shown here is an example of what is deemed acceptable by the SAE.

If the tire cannot be removed for straightening repair, another acceptable method of marking is to engrave information on the inside barrel section of the wheel. Such engraving can be done with a common electric engraving tool, shown with a marking template in the photo below.



Information engraved needs only to be enough to insure traceability. The simplest thing to do is to engrave the phone number of the repair facility, where all details of the repair can then be tracked down through their repair records.
